





<u>A Teaching Moment</u>

4th Sunday of Advent "They shall name him Emmanuel, which means 'God is with us."" No other religion makes such a radical claim. To be Christian is to believe that God is truly with us. in the most personal, intimate way imaginable; he is one of What a remarkable reality. Through us! the Incarnation, God became human and lived among us to love us, to guide us, to heal us, and to strengthen us. Three days from now, we will celebrate this extraordinary gift that came to us on the first Christmas Day. All other Christmas gifts, no matter how exquisite or precious, pale in comparison to the gift of Jesus Christ. All the joys and festivities of the season, all the love and generosity that go into our beautiful holiday traditions, can be all the more meaningful when we keep this in mind. The real magic of Christmas is that we get exactly what we prayed for! Jesus has come. God has answered our prayers and given us what we truly desire in the depths of our hearts: himself, Emmanuel, God with us.
